#### Marking the Miracles and the **Milestones in Ministry**

We read in the Bible in the book of Joshua that the children of Israel often set up monuments to cause them to remember God's power, provision, and pardon. Joshua 4:24 tells us that the purpose of the monuments is to ensure that "all the people of the earth know the Lord is mighty." In CEF® we don't erect literal monuments of stone, but we do want to make sure we celebrate and remember God's power as it is demonstrated in this ministry each day.

Eleven years ago our eight regional directors met at the International Headquarters in Warrenton, Missouri and prayerfully set goals to launch ministry in every nation on Earth. That was a God-sized goal and if it was to be accomplished it would only be done by the power of God. At that time, to meet the goal would require opening of 63 nations, many of which were among the most difficult places in the entire world to establish ministry.

In CEF, establishing ministry in a country means far more than handing out literature. We declare a nation open when three criteria are in place: 1) a board to oversee the work; 2) staff or volunteers trained by CEF to reach children; 3) daily ministry to children.

Over the last several years we have witnessed God do the miraculous! On average a new nation has opened for ministry every 58 days. One by one nations have been opening, but North Korea is one that yet remains closed. And if you follow world news,

you know the Lord seems to be doing something miraculous in changing the direction of North Korea.

Two years ago, we began challenging children and adults to pray that the children in North Korea would be able to have a Good News Club® like children in other countries. We believe the day will soon come when that prayer is answered and the doors of North Korea will be open to the Gospel. That will certainly be a milestone in ministry.

In recent years we have not only seen countries opening at a record pace, we have seen phenomenal growth in the number of children reached. In 2007 we shared the Gospel with just over 8 million children. In 2017 that number grew to nearly 22.9 million children. That's an increase of 284 percent. The number of people who received CEF training has also grown dramatically. In 2007 God gave us the privilege to train over 259,000 believers to effectively share the Gospel. Since then we have trained over 3.1 million Christ-followers in effective evangelism and discipleship methods.

Our founder, Mr. Overholtzer, prayed for "an army of evangelists" that would one day encircle the globe sharing the Good News of Jesus, and those prayers are being fulfilled before our eyes. Also, it may surprise you to learn that only one-third of those trained are volunteers or staff in CEF ministry. The others serve with other organizations, including their local churches.

If the Lord tarries, we intend to share the Good News with millions more, but for now we want to mark the miracles and milestones in ministry so all will know "the Lord is mighty."



## A Little Boy Converts His Mother

## by D.L. Moody



I remember, when on the North Side, I tried to reach a family time and again and failed. One night in the meeting, I noticed one of the little boys of that family. He hadn't come for any good, however; he was sticking pins in the backs of the other boys.

I thought if I could get hold of him it would do good. I used always to go to the door and shake hands with the boys, and when I got to the door and saw this little boy coming out, I shook hands with him, and patted him on the head, and said I was glad to see him, and hoped he would come again. He hung his head and went away.

The next night, however, he came back, and he behaved better than he did the previous night. He came two or three after, and then asked us to pray for him that he might become a Christian. That was a happy night for me. He became a Christian, and a good one.

One night I saw him weeping. I wondered if his old temper had got hold of him again, and when he got up I wondered what he was going to say. "I wish you would pray for my mother," he said. When the meeting was over I went to him, and asked, "Have you ever spoken to your mother, or tried to pray with her?" "Well, you know, Mr. Moody," he replied, "I never had an opportunity; she don't believe, and won't hear me." "Now," I said, "I want you to talk to your mother tonight." For years I had been trying to reach her and couldn't do it. So I urged him to talk to her that night, and I said, "I will pray for you both."

When he got to the sitting-room he found some people there, and he sat waiting for an opportunity, when his mother said it was time for him to go to bed. He went to the door undecided. He took a step, stopped, and turned around, and hesitated for a minute, then ran to his mother and threw his arms around her neck, and buried his face in her bosom. "What is the matter?" she asked; she thought he was sick. Between his sobs he told

his mother how for five weeks he had wanted to be a Christian; how he had stopped swearing; how he was trying to be obedient to her, and how happy he would be if she would be a Christian, and then went off to bed. She sat for a few minutes, but couldn't stand it, and went up to his room. When she got to the door she heard him weeping, and praying, "O God, convert my dear mother." She came down again, but couldn't sleep that night.

Next day she told the boy to go and ask Mr. Moody to come over and see her. He called at my place of business (I was in business then), and I went over as quiet as I could. I found her sitting in a rocking-chair weeping. "Mr. Moody," she said, "I want to become a Christian." "What has brought that change over you? I thought you didn't believe in it." Then she told me how her boy had come to her, and how she hadn't slept any all night, and how her sin rose up before her like a dark mountain. The next Sunday that boy came and led that mother into the Sabbath-school, and she became a Christian worker.

> O little children, if you find Christ, tell it to your fathers and mothers. Throw your arms around their necks and lead them to Jesus.







#### **EVANGELIZE.** DISCIPLE. ESTABLISH.

Envision a world in which every child in every nation could hear about Jesus. That's the world we dream about, discuss, and desire every day. In 1937 our founder, Jesse Overholtzer, would sit at his desk with his finger on a portion of the globe, praying for the children of that nation. He prayed that someday "an army of evangelists would encircle the globe" telling boys and girls about Jesus. Last year, that army reached nearly 22.9 million children with the

Good News of Jesus. God has opened almost every nation to the work of CEF, but there are still millions of boys and girls who need to hear about Jesus. As we continue to evangelize and disciple boys and girls and establish them in the local church, our goal is to reach higher and higher percentages of the population of each country. In Kenya, for example, there are 19 million children in the 4-14 window—the ages in which people are most likely to come to Christ. In the last year CEF missionaries had opportunity to share the Gospel with over 9 percent of the Kenyan children. Our goal is to train more workers, provide them with excellent materials, and establish more Good News Clubs so that we may reach Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day.

#### BIBLICAL, INTENTIONAL, AND FOCUSED – THE CEF® STRATEGY

Psalm 78 has great significance to the work of *CEF*. Verses 6 and 7 speak to the purpose of our ministry: "That the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments." The focus of *CEF* is upon the next generation. The ministry is intentional to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with children while they are most open to the Gospel.

Matthew 28:19 makes clear the scope of the mission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." Only by the grace of God will we meet the challenge before us to reach the next generation in every nation. But we believe God has given us a strategy that is biblical, intentional, and focused. Read below to understand this strategy and how it moves us toward ensuring that the next generation might know.



**Training** | Training prepares men and women to effectively evangelize and disciple the generation to come. Each year hundreds of thousands of students are trained to effectively evangelize and disciple the next generation.



**Equipping** | Equipping produces materials for trained men and women to effectively evangelize and disciple the generation to come. Each year millions of pieces of literature are distributed around the globe to put the best teaching and discipleship materials into the hands of our missionaries.



**Supporting** | Supporting provides the resources for trained and equipped men and women to focus on effectively evangelizing and discipling the generation to come. Each year nearly 900 *Sponsor-A-National*™ recipients in 130 countries receive much-needed support.



### **GOOD NEWS IS IN THE AIR IN NORTH KOREA!**

During International Conference in May 2017 wristbands were handed out to encourage children and adults to pray for the children in North Korea—that they would be able to have a Good News Club just like children in other countries. At that time we knew the only hope for opening North Korea was for God to work in the hearts of leaders to bring about radical change. Although as of this writing we have not seen the doors of North Korea swing open to the Gospel, we have seen incredible movement. The news is filled with stories related to the cessation of conflict, the restoration of peace, and the meetings of world leaders. God is on the move and we believe the doors will open in God's perfect timing.

> In the meantime, rejoice that Good News is in the air in North Korea—literally. During the months when prevailing winds allow, CEF missionaries in South Korea release Gospel balloons which land in North Korea. That's right; a balloon about the size of a bed pillow carries the message of the Gospel into North Korea. For now we wait and pray, and trust that very soon the doors will open wide.

When they do, CEF chapters in South Korea stand ready to send missionaries and materials so that the


#### **VIRGIN ISLANDS**





## WHY WE SUPPORT Stories from our ministry partners

**How Can We Not?**—By Ron and Joyce Swanson



Fifty years ago we arrived as newlyweds in Cedar Rapids, Iowa where Ron started a career as an avionics design engineer. That was when we had our first CEF encounter when our church held

up to twenty 5-Day Clubs each summer throughout the city.

Subsequent CEF encounters occurred over many years as we and our four children visited Joyce's parents' farm in North Dakota. We got to know Morris and Linda Erickson, who served with CEF as a local director, then North Dakota state director, then district director. Each visit he would tell us about their ministry and the changed lives of children through clubs, fair ministry, summer Camp Good News," and "Christmas Parties for Jesus." However, at the time we felt "too busy" to get involved in CEF.

In July 2004 a tragic accident took the life of the Ericksons' infant grandson, Micah. At the funeral we decided to volunteer for a week at the CEF International Headquarters in loving memory of Micah. His dad, Todd Erickson, was serving as a local director in North Dakota at this time.

At International Headquarters we spent daytime hours checking children's correspondence Bible lessons. Since it was the week for the annual USA State Directors meetings, we attended their evening sessions. We heard Reese Kauffman speak for the first time and were impressed with his commitment to prayer, vision for CEF, and love for the children. As we met state leaders, it was obvious that this culture was replicated in them also.

In 2005 we moved to the Kansas City area. Although there was an established CEF chapter, the believers we met were

unaware of the ministry and the 2001 Supreme Court decision giving us the opportunity to reach children in our public schools. We decided to get involved by talking about CEF with nearly everyone we knew, making presentations at churches, organizing and serving in Good News Club, volunteering at Headquarters, and inviting others to go with us.

We've also attended Presidential Briefings and two International Conferences, where we have met many national missionaries from various countries. God has continually opened our eyes and touched our hearts as it has become apparent that this organization with the vision to reach Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day is for real! The commission given by Jesus to "go to all nations" is happening.

#### SO, WHY DO WE SUPPORT CEF?


How can we not support CEF with our time, treasure, and prayers after seeing firsthand the value of its goal of evangelizing and discipling the world's children in God's Word?


