What is a 5-Day Club?

A neighbourhood Bible Club that meets for five consecutive days, for approximately one hour. Children from the area come together to hear the Gospel clearly and simply presented. Clubs can be held during the summer or at other times of year when children have school holidays. Local churches are encouraged to stand behind their young people who give their

Why hold 5-Day Clubs?

There are four main purposes of 5-Day Clubs:

- To evangelise unreached children from different nationalities, religions and social
- To help saved children grow in Christ.
 - To establish unchurched children in a local Bibleteaching church or Sunday school.
 - To lead to Good News Clubs being started.



Where is the Club held?

Possible locations in the neighbourhood:

- Gardens
- Indoors
- Playground or park
- Beach
- Outdoor swimming pool
- Camping site



What is the Club **Programme?**

- Bible Lesson
- Memory verse
- Songs
- Prayer
- Continued missionary story
- Review quiz



What do host families do?

- Make their garden or home available for the Club to be held.
- Help invite neighbourhood children to the Club.
- Other involvement as desired (e.g. sit with the children during Club, encourage them to come back next day).
- Pray for the Club and the children attending.



Who does the teaching?

- Many 5-Day Clubs are taught by young people who give several weeks of their holidays to be a summer missionary.
- Other concerned Christians who have free time during the summer are also very welcome in this ministry.
- A team can teach three or possibly four Clubs per day.
- CEF provides the training and can organise the locations.
