What Disturbs You?

There are so many valid answers to that question. In today's world, there can be multiple things disturbing us all at the same time: Brexit, the economy, difficult relationships, personal health concerns, financial insecurity, social and moral decline. This list is certainly not exhaustive! Many of us are disturbed about many things. On the other hand, could it be possible that many of us bury our heads in the sand, attempting to live a comfortable life, devoid of disturbance? Could it be that we are disturbed and bothered by things which, in the grand scheme of eternity, are not really that important at all?

Nehemiah's Example

An example of godly disturbance is Nehemiah. He was open, honest, and disturbed by something that really mattered. He was bothered by the spiritual state of Jerusalem; he was disturbed by the fact that the people were in great trouble and shame. He was concerned about God's glory being restored. He wept, he fasted, he prayed. But he didn't stop there. After pouring out his heart before God, he got up, dried his tears and got to work. He travelled back to Jerusalem and inspected the wall to see the damage for himself. He rode all around the city to see what needed done. Then he came up with a plan of action.

Nehemiah didn't keep the plan to himself. He didn't try to rebuild the city wall singlehandedly. He recruited volunteers. He shared his vision and the people caught it. "...And they said, 'Let us rise up and build.' So they strengthened their hands for the good work" (Nehemiah 2:18, ESV). Each man worked on the portion of the wall that was outside his home. When opposition arose, they laid bricks with one hand and wielded a sword with the other. When they grew tired and weary, they asked God to

strengthen their hands for the work that was still before them. They built and they fought, but not in their own strength. They worked in the power of God who was with them every step.

God thwarted the plans of the enemies that rose up. He stopped the conspiracies that came against Nehemiah and his team of builders. God strengthened His people to build and to defend, and, after only 52 days, the wall was complete.

Nehemiah was disturbed, he prayed, he inspected, he recruited, he built, and God blessed the work of his hands.

Bringing it Home

When we take a good, hard look at society around us, we should be disturbed, but we should not despair. The sin and depravity of our culture may tempt us to hide within the four walls of our churches and homes, just waiting for Jesus to come back and make it all right again. But God placed you in your community—your culture—your generation—for such a time as this. Take your disturbance before the Lord. Weep. Fast. Pray for your country, then rise and see the task God has placed before us.

Our society won't be fixed with a wall around the city. It will be mended

by the Gospel alone, and CEF is here to help you declare and display the Gospel in your community. It's time to rise up and strengthen our hands for the good work that lies before us.

There are many opportunities for you to get involved in the work of CEF. Pray and give so the work can continue and grow. Join us in direct outreach to children in your community. Get a group together and start a Good News Club. Host an Easter Club in your home or church or community centre. CEF is here to provide you with the training and resources you need!

Nehemiah and his builders succeeded, not because of their programmes, or strength or prowess. They succeeded because God was on their side. We know that CEF can do nothing apart from the sovereign grace of God. It is not our programmes, or literature, or volunteers who guarantee success; it is the Saviour of the World who strengthens our hands. God doesn't need us to do His work, but He chooses to use us—to work in us and through us and for us. He is the One who is strong and sufficient, who works on our behalf, who provides what is needed. He is the One in whom we place our confidence and trust. He is the One who desires us to be involved in His great spiritual rebuilding work in Great Britain.

Do you have anyone in the church who could maybe tell the Easter story in the local school in an assembly or to a class?

- Get in touch with the school and see if they would let you help in this way with their curriculum. They may also let you give out Easter Party invitations to the children.

- You could still hold an Easter Party and ask a local primary school if they will give out invitations to the children at the school.

If you don't have the people to run a party ...

Serving a global God

“We must be global Christians with a global mission because our God is a global God.”

We serve a global God—a God who desires and deserves the worship of every tribe, nation, and tongue. He has graciously given Child Evangelism Fellowship a global reach—active ministry in nearly every country around the globe. But the work is far from complete. Though there is ministry in most countries as we count them, there are still thousands of people groups and tribes within those countries who have yet to hear the name of Jesus—who cannot give Him the worship He alone deserves.



All around the world there are men and women, CEF national leaders, who are working day in and day out to expand the ministry of CEF, many in nations where it is dangerous to be a Christian, much less share the Gospel. They could be working anywhere else, making much more money and living a life without risk. But instead they choose to spend their lives for the cause of Christ.

Meet Francis

One of these leaders is Francis, the national director in South Sudan. Last year, South Sudan was ravaged by civil war, forcing Francis, his family, and the other CEF workers out of their homes. They are now living in refugee camps, with plastic tents as their shelter and a scarcity of food and clean water—conditions

we in the West couldn't imagine.

Francis was almost ready to give up on the ministry during this difficult time. But God gave him the grace to continue. Today, he shares the Gospel with children in the refugee camps. He holds Good News Club there and even trains other believers to join him in reaching the children for Christ, right where they are, in their most desperate situation. Tens of thousands of children in refugee camps have heard the Gospel, thanks to God's grace working in Francis's life.

Meet Zbyšek

Zbyšek is another CEF leader. He works in the Czech Republic, the most atheistic country in Europe. In 2017, Zbyšek attended a leaders' conference where the Lord gave him a burden for the areas of his country that were not yet touched by CEF ministry. One of those areas was Prague, the capital city. Even though it would be inconvenient from a human standpoint, Zbyšek chose the path of obedience. Every week, he has been taking a four-hour train ride to Prague. (Zbyšek lives in the western part of the country; Prague is in the east.) He opened a CEF office in the city, where he works and spends the night. He meets with pastors, promotes the ministry, works to recruit volunteers, and shares the Gospel with children at every opportunity. God even opened the door for him to do an Easter party club in a Prague public school, where he told the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. (An incredible event, considering 57% of people in the Czech Republic call themselves atheists!) Every

week, Zbyšek leaves his family, travels to Prague, works to get the ministry established, and returns home. He toils week after week so that every child in Prague, and in the Czech Republic, has a chance to hear the Gospel.

Meet Diane

Diane* lives and ministers in a country where it is illegal to share the Gospel. If the government found out about her ministry, she would have to flee the country. Yet every day she trusts God to give her boldness, strength, and protection as she shares the Good News with children. She flies in the face of danger, risking everything so that God's glory would be declared in her nation—so that children would have a chance to respond to the Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection.

CEF is a global ministry because of men and women like Francis, Zbyšek, and Diane who make sacrifices every day to bring the Gospel to children in their nations. And there are many more leaders just like them whose stories are yet to be told. Join us in thanking God for these leaders and praying for them. Ask God to encourage them, protect them, and strengthen them to persevere in declaring God's glory to the children among the nations.
