


that there would be a cost to carry out the Great Commission. "Do not be surprised, brothers, that the world hates you" (1 John 3:13). The signs of opposition are all around us. Nearly every week we hear of one of our workers suffering for the sake of the Gospel. On the international scene, the cost of following Christ is becoming greater and greater. But as in the days of Jesus, persecution does not stop the spread of the Gospel; rather, it accelerates it. Here in the U.S., our culture is speeding away from God. We still have great freedom, but with that freedom comes the responsibility to do everything in our power to reach the next generation—across the street and around the world.

The world population is well beyond 7.7 billion people; with 2.5 billion children under the age of 15 who desperately need to hear the Good News. The Lord has given His Church the task of taking the Gospel to every corner of the Earth so that all may know Jesus' words, "... I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). Taking the Gospel to Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day is a daunting task and will not be accomplished without sacrifice.

Our workers around the world have been striving together for the sake of the Gospel (Philippians 1:27-29), "not counting their lives dear unto themselves" (Acts 20:24). God has used their sacrifices to reach the greatest number of children in the

2018! We are thrilled that the number of Good News Clubs increased by 30 percent! The impact of that growth is huge because this is our core ministry, where boys and girls gather weekly to hear God's Word. The Lord is blessing our efforts to evangelize, disciple, and establish children in the local church.

The task, however, remains unfinished. Even though the Lord has made it possible to establish CEF ministry in most nations of the world, there are still billions of children waiting to hear. The Lord has burdened our hearts with the absoluteness of Luke 10:2, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." We are asking our staff, volunteers, and ministry partners to pray earnestly—to beseech, implore, beg the Lord of the harvest to raise up more workers. The need for more workers is abundantly clear because the harvest is abundant. We must ask God to call and send workers to reach children while there is still time.

We are praying for 1,600 more workers worldwide in the next three years to allow us to move from reaching 25 million children annually to reaching 45 million. This is a God-sized vision, but as someone said, "Attempt something so great for God, it's doomed to failure unless God be in it."

Opposition is real and the cost of sharing the Gospel is significant, but God is at work in wonderful ways. God has used your prayers and gifts to get the Good News to over 7 million children in the Middle East during the last 12 months. Remember. Set in Sri Lanka, the story tells of Chathuri, who as a little girl lost everything in the tsunami that struck her country. Chathuri went to a *Good News Club* held at a refugee camp for

those impacted by the tsunami. There she heard the Gospel and accepted Jesus as her Savior. Others will long remember the tsunami



as the day they lost all their possessions, but Chathuri remembers it as the day she heard of Jesus and was saved eternally.

In many places in the Middle East, 280 staff worked tirelessly training believers to share the Gospel using this story. Some trainings were held in public places with many students, and others were held in secret because they were in sensitive countries, but when all was said and done 3,897 trainings had been conducted, equipping 57,536 teachers! These teachers committed to go into their communities and share the Good News through Christmas Party Clubs.

God multiplied the impact of the 280 staff, and 162,996 Christmas Party Clubs were held throughout the Middle East. Over 5.8 million children heard of Jesus, and over 2 million were

counseled for salvation. God always does exceedingly beyond what we could ask or think!

After one week I met a girl who was one of these children. She told me that her brother A. accepted Jesus after he read the book two times." -R.



TENTS OF BLESSING

y wife and I, along with our V team, visited two families who had opened their homes (tents) in refugee camps to CEF workers. I told one hostess that her tent was a tent of God's blessing. She was so eager to hear God's Word.

Later she said, "... When we were having a lot of difficulties...only Christians came to encourage and help us. I want to extend our tent further so the children around us can hear God's Word."

While we were there, the children rushed to the tents and sang to us. There are about 2.5 million refugees in this place. Our CEF leader in the country spoke to several men in the camp. He said it is impossible for him to reach out to these people and share the Good News with them in their home country, but they are opening their hearts here in the camps.

Why did God show me this place? Because this golden opportunity should not be missed! After discussing with local workers, we decided to launch a project called "Tents of Blessing" and will collaborate with the churches to train around 200 volunteers to start 100 Good News Clubs at the tents, multiplying the number each year.

Please pray for this project so we can share the Gospel with the children in refugee camps while the door is still open and before they are sent back home.




assion for the Great Commission was planted in my heart at the age of 19. I repented of my sin and trusted in King Jesus when I was ten years old. Unfortunately, I did not grow much in my faith during my teenage years, and few of my friends knew that I was a Christian. I still look back on those years with much sadness and regret. Our God, however, is a faithful and loving Father who, as Hebrews 12:6 teaches, "disciplines the one He loves" (cf. Proverbs 3:12). My heavenly Father got up close and personal in His disciplinary work in my life in the summer of 1976, putting me flat on my back for a month and train-wrecking my college baseball career. I am so glad He did.

As I was recovering from a serious injury, a wonderful group of teenagers and young adults reached out to me and began loving me unconditionally in Christ. An older man named Jack Fordham taught me how to share the Gospel and to start doing the work of a "soul winner," a term I wish we could reclaim. I started going out on what we called "Tuesday Night Visitation," where we would go door to door and tell others about Jesus. We did not care who

was in the house. If they were human, we knew they needed Jesus just like us. I, in particular, went after my friends from high school. The word soon got out that Tuesday night was "spiritual hit man night" when Danny would come knocking on your door, so a number of my friends begin to find a way to be away from home on Tuesday nights. At that time, I did not have enough sense to go on a different night! It was a time of great spiritual growth in my life.

But in the summer of 1977 I came to a radically new understanding of just who my neighbor is. Our church was not only active in local missions and evangelism, but it was also active in mission work thousands of miles away. For several years our church had adopted a Native American tribe in and around Sells, Arizona, known as the Tohono O'odham Nation. Alcoholism and poverty were rampant among this tribe. The Gospel witness was a faint light as



That mission trip was life changing for me in so many ways. I now had a new sense of calling and direction as to my future service to Christ. I also came home with a new set of eyes as to who is my neighbor, which I have never lost. My neighbor may live across the street, but he or she may also live across the nation or in a different part of the world. If they need to be loved and cared for in Jesus' name, no matter who they are or where they live, they are my neighbors.

John Wesley said, "Do all the good that you can, by all the means you can, in all the places you can, at all the times that you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can." I would say that is a very good formula for loving your neighbor well and a very good foundation for a Great Commission life. Just as those who reached out to me laid that foundation, we must plant the seeds of the Great Commission with the next generation, because they are the ones who will take up the mantle next to share the news of King Jesus.

One of the reasons I appreciate the work of Child Evangelism Fellowship® is their dedication to taking the Gospel to Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day. They are sold out to the Great Commission, and they are daily working in the most fruitful mission field in all the world—children.

FRONTLINES

CHICAGO:

One of the most amazing privileges of being a Christian is being able to sit in the front row and see God work in hearts and lives! At a club I was teaching there was one of those front row moments. I taught a Bible lesson and then gave the children a chance to follow up on what had been taught by talking with me further. Eight children indicated that they wanted to do so. I called over one of our summer missionaries; she talked with four girls and I talked with four boys. One of the boys had talked with me many times about what it means to believe in Jesus; the other three boys told me that they had never before embraced Jesus and believed in Him for the forgiveness of their sins. We sat on the steps and talked about Jesus and His work for us for over 30 minutes.

Toward the end of our discussion as I spoke of believing in Jesus, one of the boys firmly held up his hand like a stop sign. "Can I do that right now?" he said with tears welling up in his eyes. He prayed in his own words, ending his prayer with, "Jesus, I want to follow you all the days of my life..." Two other boys made professions of faith as well.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC:

12-year-old Maria uses The Wonder Devotional Book each day. For over a year, and at great sacrifice, she has sent a monthly offering of \$1 from her lunch money to help tell other children about Jesus. (The average adult earns only \$5-10/day so you can see what a sacrifice this is!)

BENIN:

Sold to Voodoo, Valuable to God

Espides, CEF missionary in Benin, West Africa, lives in an area considered the cradle of voodoo. Parents are encouraged to sell their children to voodoo worshipers for what amounts to only \$8 in U.S. currency! Many children are sold and convinced to also become voodoo worshipers. Two years ago Espides started a children's ministry. By last year more than 400 children had heard the Gospel in 10 different Good News Clubs. Now the number is growing thanks to many newly trained volunteers. These volunteers tell children that God loves themand that they are valuable to Him. There have been many spiritual attacks on this work. Children are even persecuted for their faith. One boy is beaten by his dad every time he returns home from Good News Club, yet he still comes to learn about the God who loves him.

CANADA:

"Nine years ago I was introduced to Jesus for the first time at a 5-Day Club® and my life has never been the same. Had I not gone to that club as a child, who knows if I would ever have heard the Gospel or decided to follow Christ. It is very important that we reach these kids because most of them are like me—they have little or no biblical knowledge. I saw a little bit of myself in each child I talked to this summer, and it makes it all worth it." Praise God—Maria trusted Christ in a 5-Day Club and also went to Camp Good News®. Later she was asked to be a junior camp counselor and then a summer missionary. Now Maria is a Good News Club teacher in her home town!



Often they will help avoid or minimize costs and taxes.

What are some of the options?

- Gifting non-cash assets: Stock or marketable securities, IRA gifts, real estate, business interests, life insurance, farm commodities, tangible personal property
- Gifts that produce lifetime income: Charitable Gift Annuities, Charitable Remainder Trusts
- Gifts in a will: A percentage or tithe,
 A Child Named Charity—some families
 choose to add a "child named Charity."
 Insure that your will reflects your family
 and charitable goals.

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
