Knowing that the authorities would most likely visit her, she immediately took time off from work, rushed home and removed anything that might incriminate her—she

finished just in time. Her house was searched but nothing was found.

The home of the boy was also searched and the police officer took the boy into the car and drove him to the police station.

The parents of the boy were known for their bad lifestyle. The father and grandfather are heavy drinkers and often violate public order. His mother suffers, but does the same. The children are often hungry, dirty and missing school a lot.

But at camp through the Bible lessons the Lord had touched the boy's heart. He had accepted Jesus as Lord and Saviour. And now in the police car the boy started to talk to the officer about God. He said that we should stop drinking, stop smoking and stop doing bad things. But without Jesus it is impossible.

On the second day of the camp, Kevin was so touched by God's Word that he asked for a Bible to take home. Like Kevin, many other children came to the camp, despite the very hot weather, and two of them arrived even before the starting time. We are so thankful to God for all that he did in the lives of these children. Please continue to pray for them.

Change can be difficult but we rejoiced to see the literature ministry continue to grow as the regional office provided support to countries developing their literature outreach.

When we first came into the work, multimedia meant filmstrips and slide presentations. Then, along came

the Internet and the digital age with multimedia taking on a much broader meaning! A g a i n, CEF adapted and made the transition. I eventually swapped my paint brush and paper for a stylus pen and computer to illustrate the materials.

This past year, Sue and I faced a new transition in our lives. This time the change was in location. With the selling of Kilchzimmer, the leadership asked if we would consider continuing our ministry with the European Regional Office from the *CEF* Romania national office and training center in Sibiu.

By this time, our three daughters were grown and out of the home, I continued to work with literature and multimedia production while Sue was involved as an administrative assistant in the Education Department.

Through difficulties and setbacks we faced this past year, we continue to place our trust in the Lord and are excited about this next step, knowing the changes are a result of growth in the ministry and part of God's perfect timing.

We made the move to Sibiu on 31, March. The AMEC (CEF) training center is now filled with 21 CMLC students from 12 countries. We have been blessed to have a small part in equipping another generation to reach children with the Gospel while the literature and multimedia ministries continue to grow, providing Biblically sound materials.
