ears overflowed from eight-yearold Molly's\* face as I sat crosslegged with her in the school hallway while she was made a new creation in Christ. When Molly was six months old, she was abandoned in a hotel room by her mom and her grandmother took full custody of her. Her dad has been missing for several years and they wonder if he has died from his heroin addiction. Because of drugs, her mom is now in jail for the third time.

Her grandmother called and asked, "At club have you had any reason to be concerned about Molly hurting herself?" She explained that from five to seven years of age Molly had been cutting herself and desiring to

take her life. She said, "Since Molly started going to Good News Club she is a different child. Every morning she wakes me up and says, 'Nana, read to me my devotion from Good News Club!' and every night she asks, 'How many more sleeps until church club at school?" Her grandmother then thanked me for making an impact in her granddaughter.

It brings tears of joy to my eyes every time I see Molly at GNC™ and the obvious difference in her life. Each week she expresses a hunger to know God. Once, as I shared from Hebrews 13:5 that God promised He would never leave her, Molly brightened into a huge smile and said, "Now I do not just have my dog, I have Jesus!"

## **POWER OF PRAYER**

Aaron's\* devout Hindu grandfather was upset when he learned Aaron and his sister attended Good News Club. Aaron prayed he could still go to club and be allowed to attend the GNC Appreciation Sunday that would be held at a Christian church. **KNOWING WHAT IT** WAS LIKE TO BE A **HURTING CHILD AND** THE DIFFERENCE **JESUS MADE IN MY** LIFE, I WANTED THE **CHILDREN IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD TO KNOW JESUS TOO.** 

s a young child, I was an unhappy orphan in Chicago who felt unloved due to sexual and physical abuse and abandonment. But I was able to attend a Good News Club in our neighborhood that I absolutely loved. I learned Jesus loves me and at age six became a Christian. I still vividly remember the joy and hope it gave me.

Years later, after I began a family of my own, I started a GNC in our home. Knowing what it was like to be a hurting child and the difference Jesus made in my life, I wanted the children in my neighborhood to know Jesus too. Each week for about five years, I

taught 15 to 40 children in our home and then continued as a GNC helper for many years.

About 20 years later when I was in my front yard, a car stopped and a young man got out and introduced himself. He had been in my GNC and was now a pastor at a church in California. He was excited to tell me that through the Good New Club he became a Christian and followed the Lord.

Through the GNC I learned about Jesus and have followed Him all my life, teaching, leading, sharing, and serving as a missionary to Mexico.


## a life set apart

## **The Difference God Makes**

A volunteer in a sensitive country organized a small camp for children and afterward continued to meet with them. After meeting several times, one boy called to say he had unintentionally told someone about the camp. Knowing that the authorities would most likely come to visit her, she immediately took time off from work, rushed home, and removed anything that might incriminate her. And it was just in time. When the police searched the house, they didn't find anything.

But the home of the boy was also searched and he was put into a police car to be taken to the police station.

The family was known for their bad lifestyle. His father, mother, and grandfather are strong drinkers who often violate public order. The children are often hungry, dirty, and frequently miss school.

But through the Bible lessons at camp the Lord had touched this boy's heart and he accepted Jesus as his Savior.

While in the police car the boy talked to the officer about God. "One should stop drinking, stop smoking, and stop doing bad things," the boy told him. "But without Jesus it doesn't work. We must receive Jesus into our hearts and He frees you from sin. If Jesus saves you, then when you die, you will come to the Golden City. But if you do not accept Christ as Savior, you won't be in paradise with Him."

The policeman listened for some time, then braked sharply, turned around, and took the boy home.

He later told someone, "I couldn't listen to this boy any longer. I know his family very well and how they live. If Christ can change people's lives in this way, I didn't want to oppose it. We could not change this family, although great efforts were made. Through the boy God himself began to work in them. I am a man and could not hold back the tears when I listened to the boy."



## EQUIPPED to ENCOURAGE

he sun never sets on the ministry of Child Evangelism Fellowship as people from various cultures who speak different languages strive to achieve the same goal—evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, disciple them in the Word of God, and establish them in a local church for Christian living. By the grace of God, this 82-year-old ministry continues to grow as we train, equip, and

support laborers to go into the harvest.

Translated into over 90 languages, CEF literature equips missionaries around the world with stories, and songs as well as booklets and

biblically sound visualized Bible lessons, missions devotionals for children.



A pastor in Sri Lanka shared, "Children enjoyed these lessons and were convicted of their sins and accepted Jesus. They loved the pictures in the lessons and were able to understand the Creation very well."

Bogdan Bassara, CEF International Multimedia Director, visited Good News Clubs and other ministries in schools in Uganda and Kenya. The highlight of his trip was "seeing how attentive children are when the Bible lesson is taught. It was amazing to see every teacher using CEF flashcards and many children coming to the clubs with The Wonder Devotional Book or Every Day with God in their hands."

CEF teaches boys and girls about God from the Bible and also encourages them to spend time in God's Word every day. Devotional materials are given to children to help them develop a habit of personal Bible study and prayer. During the first weeks of Good News Club, Jantina worked with the children to teach them how to use the *Every Day* with God devotional booklet. 


simplified). These booklets are a great asset to the Every Day aspect of our vision.

Trained and equipped nationals are the ideal individuals to minister to children in their countries. They already speak the language, know the culture, and can work where people of other nations are not welcomed.

Since 1972 the Sponsor-A-National<sup>™</sup> program has provided financial assistance to trained nationals who live in areas where it is difficult to raise support. Presently over 900 CEF national missionaries receive assistance through the SPAN™ program each month. This enables them to spend more time sharing the Good News about Jesus with the children.



ori was helping her retired parents sort and pack for a move when she found a little Wordless Book. She showed it to her mother, Birtie, who was delighted to see it again and shared with Lori the story of how she received the little book.



As best as she can remember, Birtie was around ten years old when her parents took her to the Oklahoma State Fair. It was there someone shared with her the Gospel using The Wordless Book. Birtie trusted in Jesus as her Savior that day and was

given a Wordless Book of her own. She has treasured it ever since.

The Wordless Book has pages of color rather than any words. It is green on the outside with a page each inside of gold, black, red, and white. The colors are used to share the Gospel message on a child's level.

As Lori thought about the impact of that little book and how it was the tool that brought her mother to the Lord,

she wanted more people to know how to share the Gospel so simply and clearly. That desire led Lori to arrange special training for all the staff of their upcoming Rodeo Bible Camp.

Thirty teens and adults showed up for an evening training with CEF. Each was given a Wordless Book to use in presenting the Gospel to children attending the rodeo camp.

Child Evangelism Fellowship has a seminar course entitled "1.2.3 Jesus Loves Me" that shows how to share the message of salvation in a way that a child can understand. Notes are provided and helpful bookmarks with the basic Gospel truths that can be placed in the Bible as reminders of what to share with a child.

The hour-long training equipped the staff to know how to share the truths of the Gospel using The Wordless Book. The attendees found the training practical and encouraging as they not only learned how to share the Gospel but once again were reminded of the wonderful grace of God that provides salvation to all who believe.

One seasoned cowboy commented

that the training helped him be more confident in sharing the Gospel message.

Two weeks after the training, Rodeo Bible Camp staff put into practice what they learned as they ministered to 44 campers. While children were trained in roping, riding, steer wrestling, and other rodeo events, staff watched for opportunities to share the Gospel. Four campers trusted in Jesus as a result of the camp ministry and training.

Lori was able to use the training she received that night to lead a girl to the Lord at her church's vacation Bible school a few weeks later.

The Wordless Book is just one tool that can be used to share the Gospel message with children, but it is one that is special to Lori and to her mother,

uring a training class, the instructor demonstrated how to lead a child to Christ using *The Wordless Book*. The next day, one of the students phoned to tell the instructor that she had just practiced The Wordless Book. She first shared with her six-year-old daughter who responded by wanting to receive Christ as her Savior. After that, she shared *The Wordless* Book with her husband, and he wanted to receive Christ, too.

Andrei from Bulgaria had the opportunity to work in Cyprus, earning a good salary. But he knew the Lord had something different for

hat do you do when your Good News Club is running well? Start a second Good News Club! In 2015, Harvest Bible Church partnered with CEF of Lancaster County to open a second GNC at Brecht Elementary School in Manheim Township.

The church already had a team that had been running a club at Wharton Elementary School in the School District of Lancaster, and they had enough volunteers to start another club. Brecht was chosen because it was close to their new location in Manheim Township.

Since its beginning, the club has ranged from 6 to 22 students, and for the most part, the team of volunteers has remained the same. When asked why so many volunteers return year after year, team leader Stacie Marrie replied, "We love it!"

The team's love for the children is evident as they

listen carefully to prayer requests and address the children's questions in small group time. Whether there are 6 or 16 children, each adult in club works to ensure that the children are heard and valued. As the current students were asked what they enjoyed about club, each one mentioned something about their leaders. They know they are loved.

The Brecht team has been blessed with a wonderful relationship with their school principal and secretary; and Harvest Bible invested in the school—hosting a staff breakfast and providing "rainy day recess bins" for the classrooms.

There are many after-school activities at Brecht, which can sometimes decrease the number of students who attend the club. The team asks for prayer that more children would hear

## More Good News

A Ugandan pastor said, "We have never seen anything like this. We felt so challenged when we saw the young people who were trained by CEF ministering to the children. I was surprised at the level of skills they have in

sharing Christ with the children."

A local director met with a church interested in adopting a school and shared their vision to reach the children in their county through Good News Club. An excited pastor's wife told her story: "We were praying for ways to reach our community for Christ and asked God what we should do. The Lord's answer was, 'Get the children.' I told God we could not just go get the children, the parents wouldn't let us get the children. However, God kept telling me, 'Get the children!' A few days later, my husband told me about a conversation he had with you, our local CEF director, about a program in the public school and opportunity to tell children about Jesus. That was the answer to my prayer; we had a way that we could 'get the children!'"

Lisa\* faithfully attended Good News Club all year and looked forward to the GNC Appreciation Sunday hosted by the partnering church that adopted her school's GNC. Lisa's mom came to see her daughter awarded and later told the CEF local director, "All year I have been seeing a difference in my daughter and I have desired myself to go back to church. When we went for her award I was so touched by the message that I had to go again that night. I was deeply moved by what that pastor shared. I want to begin attending there regularly!"
