SUMMER MINISTRY IMPRESSIONS FROM IRELAND

What about the other half of the verse?

On the first night of the 5-day club in our own housing estate we had 15 children standing waiting for us. It quickly became clear that most of these children had little to no Bible knowledge. What a privilege it was to share the good news of the gospel with the boys and girls, many of these children for the very first time.

On the last night of club, I gave out a little pack to each child which contained some literature and prizes. I pointed to the pack and showed the children that they would each receive a copy of the memory verse (John 3:16) which we had been learning all week. I saw the face of one child light up and they were so pleased to receive their own copy of the verse. This child then went on to ask, 'but what about the other half of the verse?' which they didn't know was printed on the back. Praise God for the hunger to continue to want to learn God's word. We pray that God will continue to work in the hearts of these children and that the seed which has been sown will bear fruit in their little lives.

We pray for opportunities to continue to minister to these children on a more regular basis. Yet being encouraged in the promise from 1 Corinthians 3:6:

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase."

The Republic of Ireland, although quick in accelerating its program of vaccinations, was quite slow and cautious this summer in removing restrictions. It was an opportune time to renew friendship with the Surf Project, and partner once again for summer camps at the CEF Oceanview Camp Centre, Rossnowlagh, County Donegal. Only this time the camp centre would house only the leaders, and the children's day camps would centre around

two two-hour outdoor sessions on the beach, using three pods of eight children. This provided a Covid-safe means of spending time with up to 48 children each day, sharing the good news of the gospel. The first week was for children aged 6-11 years, and the Bible lesson series The Big Picture was a great means to see God's great design for His creation. In the second week the teenage campers were challenged to see a life lived according to God's plan using teaching from the life of Nehemiah. As leaders we were blessed to stand shoulder-toshoulder in the Lord's work as we served together from different mission organisations-CEF, OM Ireland, WorldVenture, and the Surf Project.


RAISING THE NEXT GENERATION

THE BEST EVENT OF THE WHOLE SUMMER

"Life in the Village" was the theme of this year's summer camp in Latvia. "We taught children God's principles for relationships with God and people," says Indra Baumane, the CEF National Director. She adds, "it was very relevant, because after this long time of remote learning and having to spend most of their time at home children had difficulties cooperating with each other."

Before the camp, the group leaders felt unsure of how to talk about family relationships with children from disadvantaged families. How should they teach them about God's principles for the family? The CEF material God Says was very helpful in achieving



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this goal. The program put the right emphasis on explaining love and respect in the family to children who do not receive them and do not respect their parents themselves. At the end of the camp, children who had said they would never be able to love their parents, prayed for their families and wanted to make a difference in their relationships.

As a highlight during their "Live in the Village" week, Indra and her team really wanted to give the children an opportunity to ride on a horse. Unfortunately, due to a lack in finances the horses could only be brought to camp one day and not all the children would have a turn. But on that day, there was a guest present. When he was told that it was not possible for all the children to have an opportunity to ride a horse, he gave money for the horses to be at camp the next day also and every child's dream of riding on a horse at least once, came true. "I can still see the joy and excitement of the children when they had the opportunity to ride horses," says Indra. "God arranged everything in such a way that this camp became the best event in the whole summer for those children."

SHORTFALL

Shortfall support helps new workers to answer God's call.

The Lord continues to enable us to support about 300 workers in Europe each month. This is not just a joy for the one who receives the help, but also a great encouragement for the National Director. We constantly receive messages like this: "As a National Director, I praise God for Shortfall support. As a team, we often pray for new workers.
