LEADING THE WAY

MEET JEREMIAH AND SARAH CHO

everend Jeremiah Cho grew up in a small village in South Korea. There were no churches, and his family didn't believe in Jesus. He didn't learn about God until he was invited to church in high school. One day at a revival meeting, Jeremiah realized he was a sinner and that Jesus died on the cross for his sin. He cried out to God to save him.

Two specific memories stand out to Jeremiah from early in his faith when God used Scripture to give him clear direction. During a special time of prayer and fasting, Jeremiah sought God's purpose for his life. He read Jeremiah 1:7-8.

> But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a youth'; for to all to whom I send you, you shall go, and whatever I command you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the Lord."



After telling God no three times, he finally obeyed and committed his whole life to serving God.

In 1984, Jeremiah received training for *S-Day Club*[®] ministry and enjoyed telling children about Jesus. The first child he helped lead to the Lord made a lasting impression on him. However, when the local director of *Child Evangelism Fellowship* urged him to work for *CEF*[®], he declined because he thought he had become a pastor to reach adults. But one day, God reminded Jeremiah about the spiritual situation of children and spoke to him through Lamentations 2:18-19.

...Lift your hands to him for the lives of your children, who faint for hunger at the head of every street.

For over 34 years, Jeremiah Cho has invested in the ministry of CEF[®].

Having served in a variety of positions, he brings a wealth of experience in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with children of the world. And God has blessed his labor in extraordinary ways.

- During the four years Jeremiah served as national director of Sri Lanka, the staff grew from two to twenty and reached over 39,000 children annually.
- Significant growth followed when Jeremiah became the national director of Korea, with staff increasing to over 200 workers reaching about 325,000 children. Under his leadership, South Korea became instrumental in opening six countries in the Asia Pacific Region.
- Then as regional director for the Middle East, he expanded that ministry from 137 workers reaching 700,000 children annually to 387 workers reaching over 8.5 million children.

People can clearly see Jeremiah's burden and passion to reach boys and girls for Jesus. He readily speaks of the need to reach more children, the need for more workers, the need for workers to be trained, and the need for materials to be translated.

Reverend Cho shares, "By God's grace we will seek to spread the Gospel to the 2.2 billion children around the world. The vast majority are lost in their sin. We have the privilege and responsibility to proclaim the Gospel to them because God loves them and desires to forgive their sins. We must embrace the vision of God and ask the Lord to give us everything needed to reach them. We must seek to reach Every Child, Every Nation, Every Day."

REACHING THE HURTING

PROVIDING HOPE TO FLOOD VICTIMS

ehicles in creeks, houses ripped apart, trees uprooted, and lack of water, power, and phone service—mountains of debris for miles...and miles...and miles.... Yet, this cannot begin to describe the utter devastation faced by thousands of people in eastern Kentucky after the late June



flooding. Imagine losing your home, car, pictures, and documents, along with every possession you own. Then add to it the heart-wrenching loss of a family member or friend! How do you cope? Where do you turn for answers? Many relief agencies are shoveling mud, treating mold, and providing needed physical supplies like food, portable showers, and temporary housing, which are desperately needed after such a catastrophic event! Often the deep spiritual needs are overlooked amidst pressing immediate demands. Even Christians

are struggling to understand why our good God would allow something like this to happen.

CEF has a 16-page color booklet designed to help those in crisis find biblical answers to tough questions, pointing children and their families to eternal hope found only in Jesus Christ. In the last month, we made



several trips to flood-ravaged areas to deliver Do You Wonder Why? booklets to those ministering on the front lines. Over 5,800 booklets have been delivered to 38 partner ministries, churches, camps, shelters, medical facilities, and disaster relief agencies who will share them with people affected by flooding. We met people who were rescued by helicopter from their rooftops, those who lost their livelihood and everything they owned, and a woman who lost her husband and all her worldly possessions and didn't know how or where to start anew. The outward sights pale in comparison to the inner hurt experienced by so many. At each stop, we prayed with and for those we met—some directly affected, some serving in relief efforts, some both. A long recovery period lies ahead.

Please pray with us that God will use truths from His Word to point searching individuals to our Savior as they begin to rebuild their lives from the inside out. Pray for traumatized children whose lives have been turned upside down. Even those



not directly impacted have witnessed the effects in their communities. Many of their schools have been flooded, disrupting the normal start of the school year. As you pray for flood victims, please remember the weary individuals serving on the front lines, many of whom have experienced tremendous loss themselves.

In September, phase 1 of recovery (the clean-up stage) transitioned to phase 2 (the rebuilding stage). Many areas were still without power, water, and phone service. Tents and trailers served as homes. We also concluded our own phase 1, which consisted of many phone calls and emails, along with the mass distribution of Do You Wonder Why? booklets. Please pray that God will send a CEF missionary staff member to serve full time in the area. Our phase 2 (after things settle down a bit) is to follow up with new contacts and prayerfully establish Good News Clubs in this large area of eastern Kentucky, where we currently have none. We desperately need God's help to accomplish this, but He is a big God!

The pastor continued, "Listen to this! We were overwhelmed by our visits. One father told us his 12-year-old son got upset whenever the *Good News Club* didn't meet. He was a tough boy, and now he is a totally different child because of what we taught him. Visits with this father, his son, and other families were the missing link in our ministry."

The pastor's testimony didn't stop there. "We will continue this as a church," he said. "I want to lead us into another

children's outreach project as soon as we can. We're already making plans to split our team of workers and train others. Bill, when you first told me about this vision and plan, I thought we wouldn't be able to recruit the needed volunteers, but now it seems like everyone in our church is on board."

SEND THEM BACK TO US

A s a member of Powered by Prayer, Beth has the privilege of meeting with other believers by phone early each morning. Together they bring God our praises, concerns, and challenges. Vicky, the moderator, was aware that our Tuesday *Good News Club* was under spiritual attack. Satan was using some extremely disrespectful and disruptive teens to harass the outreaches. Instead of asking God to

keep the teens away, we prayed that He would send them back to us one or two at a time and touch their hearts in the process. We prayed they would listen to the Word and that God would do a miracle in their lives. God answered our

ON MISSION TRIPS

When missionaries in a country closed to Christianity asked for support to go on a mission trip, I could not accept the request right away because it was like sending sheep in the midst of wolves. In this country it would put their lives at risk. The ministry is important, but considering the safety of the beloved workers, instead of giving permission right away, I decided we should pray about it.

One day as I prayed, God reminded me of His promise in Matthew 28:20, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." The Lord said that He will be with us not sometimes-but "always, to the end of the age." Whether I am praying with a burdened heart or sleeping, the Lord is with His disciples who are dedicated to preaching the Gospel in the mission field. So I told the missionaries, "The Lord has promised to be with us not sometimes, but always. Go on the trip."

The sheep were sent in the midst of the wolves, but the Lord had His plans. They felt the hand of God as they served and joyfully came back with a plentiful harvest.

Please pray for the safety of the workers who put their mission for the children in need of the Gospel before their own safety and are obeying their calling with faith in the Lord. And pray for the young lives who will be saved through this ministry.

DISTRIBUTING BIBLES

Some church leaders are put in prison for the sake of the Gospel, for distributing the Bible. However, such persecution does not keep some missionaries from ministry. While on their way to GNCTM with a car trunk full of Bibles for children, they reached a checkpoint where cars were inspected one by one. But they were let through without even opening the trunk. On another day, they were in the back seats of a bus with a bag full of Bibles when an inspector got on the bus and started checking all the bags. The inspector came towards them and made eye contact. Then, he got off the bus without checking their bags.

AT GOOD NEWS CLUB

Raja sat alone in GNC with a sad face. Though usually a happy boy, on this day he was heartbroken because his father had left his mother and was living with another woman and his father had beaten him. Raja said he did not want to live because he couldn't watch his mother cry anymore. His GNC teacher was grateful God led Raja to GNC that day. She told him about God, who is love, and that He is always with Raja. She encouraged him to thank God for his mother who loves him. As they talked, Raja's face brightened. Now he regularly attends GNC.



Trained and equipped nationals are the ideal individuals to minister to children in their countries. They already speak the language, know the culture, and can work where people of other nations are not welcomed.



Since 1972 the Sponsor-A-National[™] program has provided financial assistance to trained nationals who live in areas where it is difficult to raise support. Presently over 1,100 *CEF* national missionaries receive assistance through the SPAN[™] program each month. This enables them to spend more time sharing the Good News about Jesus with the children.

was born into a Christian family but did not receive Jesus Christ as Savior until I attended a *CEF* teacher training in 1993. During the class on "The Importance of Conversion," I truly understood the Gospel, repented, and put my trust in Christ for salvation. welve boys and girls were prevented from coming to club this summer because their parents wouldn't allow them to attend. They had heard in the village that we were dangerous. That's how some people view the Good News of Jesus.

But at another club held next to a day care, parents brought their children after school. There were 15 children and as many parents. Clubs were held in 12 different places and reached 1,000 children.

This year at summer camp, children were challenged to evangelize their classmates. Yuli, an 11-year-old boy who lives with his parents in France, became concerned for his best friend who is a Muslim. During the lessons, he realized his best friend didn't believe in Jesus. Yuli understood that salvation is only through Jesus and was willing to risk losing his friend by telling him about Jesus.

WHO WILL TELL THEM IF NOT ME?

While attending the *Children's Ministries Institute* in Kenya, I was offered a job as an architect with a construction company. But God convinced me to surrender all my time to Him and serve full time reaching children.

When I returned home, I set July as my target month to start Good News Club in an area where many children didn't have an opportunity to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. Although some of these children attended church with adults, BIENFAIT RÉGIS NTAKABANYURA, Burundi

I saw it was difficult for them to understand what was taught. I knew I was the one trained to share the message of salvation with these children. That was going to be hard though because we were about to move to a different neighborhood. But God had plans for these children. He answered my prayers by providing a way for me to stay. On that first Friday of our *Good News Club*, I was amazed to see 30 boys and girls come and 21 receive Jesus Christ as Savior.
