Moses tells him to be a strong and courageous leader as he guided the Children of Israel to their promised land.

# UPDATE

## Supporting our leaders at every level

"Pray also for me" (Ephesians 6:19) are just a few words which show how the Apostle Paul was grateful that the Christians he encouraged and ministered to also supported him by their prayers. Paul's prayers for the Christians in Ephesians (1:15-20 and 3:16-17) are an example to leaders how to pray for those they minister to. Their prayers for Paul are an example to us to support those who lead us spiritually, whether in CEF or in our church. Paul "urged" us to pray for leaders (1 Timothy 2:1-3) which "pleases God". Many leaders in the Bible were aware of their own weakness and dependency on God. The Apostle Paul lists a large number of people who helped him in Rome (Romans 1:1-16), along with individuals such as Tychicus (Ephesians 6:21), Timothy (1 Timothy 1:2), and Onesiphorus (2 Timothy 1:16). In the Old Testament Jethro gave very

helpful advice to Moses (Exodus 18) who was leading the Children of Israel. Ezra provided the spiritual leadership to those in Jerusalem, working alongside Nehemiah who organised the rebuilding of the city walls.

Leaders greatly appreciate individuals who help share/shoulder the responsibility of leadership, encouraging their vision for ministry. A well-functioning CEF National Committee will be a great support and assist the National Director as they direct the work in their country. A CEF Local Committee will do the same for Local Directors, working together to reach the children in a local area. Committee members have responsibility for specific aspects of the work and share in the responsibility of leadership. People who cooperate with each other and assist one another can form a more resilient team than individuals who function at a high level but in isolation.

Leaders can become overwhelmed with the weight of responsibility for the work God has called them to. Moses found this after the burning bush and repeatedly took his problems to God (Exodus 5). Leaders should not be pressurised to do "more, more, more" which will exacerbate this weight of responsibility when their resources (human or financial) are scarce. It is important for leaders to nurture their own spiritual life and have a healthy work/life balance to prevent overwork and overload. They should review this balance regularly and have times of spiritual retreat and refreshing holidays. We can encourage them by getting to know them and their family personally and respecting their personal and spiritual time. We can try to be efficient in providing what they ask of us and help with projects and



programmes. We can support them by being a cooperative team member. We can rejoice and celebrate good things with them.

"Leadership is the capacity to translate vision into reality" (Warren Bennis). "Spiritual leadership is knowing where God wants people to be and taking the initiative to use God's methods to get them there in reliance on God's power." (John Piper). We praise God for godly leaders in CEF who encourage us spiritually, practising what they preach and leading by their actions and words. Working together with them they will bless us, bless others and honour God. They need our support and prayers.

The CEF International Board of Trustees announces the appointment of the new President, Rev. Jeremiah Cho, effective August 1, 2022. Jeremiah is currently one of the eight CEF international Regional Directors. He and his wife Sarah will relocate from Seoul, South Korea to Warrenton, Missouri, USA.



Brother Jeremiah brings a wealth of experience in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with children of the world. He has served full time with CEF over the past 34 years in a number of roles including Local Director and National Director for CEF South Korea where he directed a staff of over 200 workers reaching 325,000 children.

He was a missionary to Sri Lanka and opened the country to CEF ministry. From 2014 to the present, he has served as Regional Director in a sensitive region with 28 countries, expanding that ministry from 137 to 387 workers, and expanding the reach of children from 700,000 annually to approximately 7.5 million children annually, pre-COVID.

The International Board of Trustees is grateful to God for calling Jeremiah to serve as President and lead Child Evangelism Fellowship into the future, reaching the children of the world with the Good News of the Gospel.
