The month of July was phenomenal travelling to Bonnie Scotland for two weeks to work alongside some of Britain's most incredible CEF workers, Hannah and Simon Snodgrass and John and Martha Meagher at Maryhill Evangelical Church and Allendar Evangelical Church.

Here we worked together with these churches to teach the Gospel to over twenty children. At these clubs the children's mission was to investigate the meaning behind the gold, black, red, white and green pages of the Wordless Book. They all wore their detectives hats each day in anticipation to accomplish their mission through songs, games, lessons and crafts.







the Emerald Isle - Who is God and why should we worship Him?

That was just a few of the questions asked by 9 nine year old Abigail, during our Bible-Time discussions at a Juniors Camp in Donegal, Ireland. That week we had been learning all about God's Sovereignty in the life of Joshua and it got this young girl thinking about her own life and her purpose on this Earth. These questions opened up a great opportunity to share the Gospel in a deeper way with these girls in that group. As they listened intently to what was being said and asking many more questions, I could see the wheels turning in Abigail's head as she thought about Who God is. Leading her to ask "Well if God knows everything, does He know who I will marry when I'm older?" and while we as adults may laugh fondly at a question like that, the answer has set little Abigail on a journey to enthusiastically find out more about the All Knowing God who knows all about her and her future.







The second week we taught 16 teenagers how to live godly in a godless society, studying the life of Hezekiah. We discussed themes such as trusting God in difficulties, obeying God and relying on God's good promises. There was one admirable teenager who was grieving the loss of her relative and she sought to understand how to honour God in her season of grief. These are the moments we work for! It is our priority to cultivate a safe environment where young people can ask questions about life and where we can use the Bible to help them find the answers. This is the heart of CEF ministry!

Half term HBC @ Garston Community Church

When the school bells chime to end half of the term, we somersault with excitement to begin Holiday Bible Club in G.C.C. We love when children are out of school because it means we get the chance to share with them God's Word with fun and excitement. On Wednesday 31st May, Thursday 1st June and Friday 2nd June we conducted a HBC having 15 children attending! We taught on Zacchaeus, Noah and The Ethiopian Treasurer. Here we showed how God loves us so much that He always makes a way for us to be saved. Children enjoy Bible time since we make learning so interactive and engaging through questioning and learning activities.
