A WORD FROM IULIAN MANGALAGIU CEF EUROPEAN DIRECTOR

In a world filled with uncertainty and challenges to our Christian values, it's easy to feel overwhelmed and lost. We may often find ourselves asking, "What should we do?" It's in these moments of doubt and confusion that we turn to the Word of God for guidance and reassurance. *"If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do? The Lord is in his holy temple; the Lord's throne is in heaven; His eyes see, his eyelids test the children of man."* (Psalm 11:3-4 ESV)

At first glance, these verses are posing a question without an immediate answer to our dilemmas. However, when we look closer, we find an answer far more powerful than any human wisdom can offer.

The psalmist begins by acknowledging the challenging times we live in, where the very foundations of righteousness appear to be crumbling. But the psalmist doesn't leave us in despair. Instead, he directs our eyes to the one place of unshakable certainty—the throne of God. Verse 4 assures us that the Lord is not absent or indifferent to the turmoil around us. He is firmly established in His holy temple, reigning from His heavenly throne.

Let's remember that our faith is not based on the shifting sands of this world but on the unchanging, eternal truth that God is on the throne. When we anchor our souls in this hope, we can face the many challenges of this changing world with unwavering faith and confidence. Our actions, guided by this truth, can make a profound difference in the lives of others and bring glory to God.

UKRAINIAN TEAMS

IN ESTONIA

One Muslim boy who caused problems every day at camp invited his friend Ani to come. Ani heard about Jesus for the first time—his favourite part of the camp was the Bible study. On the last day, he came before the group and prayed for salvation. God works in wonderful ways so children can hear His message.

One girl had asked a relative about God, and he said God would bring someone to answer questions he could not. That day in camp, she received answers that others were unable to give. The girl believes in Jesus, and with a group of children from camp, she

completed the correspondence course "God Cares" and received the certificate.

A 7-year-old girl listened carefully to every lesson and asked many questions. One day she said: "I have Jesus in my heart and at home I sing and talk to him because I know he hears me." The lessons we taught, she went home and showed to her family.

Ukrainian refugees have been our dear guests in Estonia since the war started in 2022.

Thousands of children had to leave their homeland and homes. Their first homes have been hotels and all free spaces around the country. After hotels were closed to refugees, about 2,000 refugees found their temporary home on the ferry boat ISABELLE at Tallinn Harbour. Regular meetings with children in the 10th floor Conference Hall were held every Monday and Thursday. We had over 40 volunteers taking part in teaching and helping.

During this time a Ukrainian school was opened in Tallinn. In many schools, children were integrated into local school classes. Several teams were formed from Ukrainian believers, who founded Baptist Bible Church in Tallinn. Several young people had taken the *Teaching Children Effectively* 1 course in Ukraine before the war, and now we were equipping them with the necessary tools to teach children. Their main focus was teenagers at the ferry boat. Hundreds of children took part at Christmas and Easter Clubs. Young teens started to visit the church.

With the team we were able to visit other towns and met Ukrainian children in Culture houses, schools and churches.

During summer the Ukrainian Bible church team organized Holiday Bible Camp in the central park and invited Ukrainian children via social media to participate. Over 40 children responded to the invitation and took part.

The Ukrainian team used their experience gained in Ukraine and on the ferry boat in Tallinn. Ukrainian young people, the community leader at the Ukrainian school and trained teachers did an exemplary job. We gave out a wide variety of different *CEF* booklets and tracts to the children and other interested people. Children enjoyed sunny days in the park and responded to the Gospel. SHORTFALL

IN MEMORY

RoyHarrison 1942 - 2023

Roy Robert Harrison, born 19 July 1942 in Northern Ireland, heard the Good News of Jesus while studying at Queen's University in Belfast. He was struck by the beauty of the forgiveness Jesus offered him. His life was changed and he wanted to share it. He also came into contact with CEF and began running Good News Clubs alongside his studies. Teaching boys and girls became a priority: he taught groups of children almost every evening.

Jesus' words in John 10:16 convinced him that God was calling him to this ministry and from then on, he was devoted to proclaiming the Gospel, especially to children who did not have the opportunity to hear it at home.

Roy went on to attend the European Bible Institute in 1963 where he met his future wife, Ruth Crawford. Ruth also wanted to serve the Lord by teaching the Bible to children. Later they were married and had four children: Joanne, Christine, Lynda and Paul.

In 1974, an invitation came from the CEF European Director, Sam Doherty, to join the regional staff and come to Switzerland. In 1993, Roy became the European Director of CEF. Roy's passion for proclaiming the Gospel to children remained: they held a Good News Club every week in their home and clubs were started in Moutier, Perrefitte and Corcelles—this one still exists.

Roy helped train many people over the years. One person remembers him coming into class with loads of sheets of paper and books under his arms, attesting to all he wanted to communicate. Many of them were called to reach boys and girls with the Gospel.

Roy retired in 2010 but continued for eight years as Area Director for Northwest Europe and Interim Director in Sweden. November 2022, he was diagnosed with myasthenia gravis. Despite his courage and that of Ruth at his side, his strength diminished. On Monday 21 August,

during his sleep, Roy went to be with his Lord and Saviour.

Roy had many gifts, but I will always remember this one. He flew into Sibiu, the city in Romania where I live. We got in the car and began the eight-hour drive to Iasi. As per usual when Roy and I got together: we started to dream, to plan and to strategise. He had his briefcase on his knee, a notepad and we talked. At one moment it got very quiet on the right side. I looked over and Roy was sitting, pen in hand, and his head was down fast asleep. I didn't know what I should do so I decided to wait. About ten minutes later, Roy woke up, and just kept writing and talking exactly where he left off. He had many wonderful gifts, but I praise God for every journey and adventure we had together.

Roy showed me the Lord Jesus. Roy was a shepherd, he cared, he understood, he helped and he protected. He was kind and generous, gracious, and sacrificial. To us he was tremendously supportive. And one of his strongest gifts was encouragement. How do you know when you were being encouraged by Roy? You just looked at his face. This summer 38 students were trained at Children's Ministry Leadership Courses held in Europe. One course took place in Sibiu, Romania. Students came from 14 countries, along with interpreters and babysitters for the start of the course on 11 June. A total of 27 students attended, some only taking the first half and others returning to complete their training. The course ended on 1 September with 21 students graduating.

The second CMLC (first six weeks only) took place in Portugal, starting 23 July and finishing 1 September. Eleven students attended, eight coming from Portugal and three from Spain. The second half of this training is planned for summer 2024.
