## The children need you

According to the proverb, one volunteer is 'Worth ten pressed men', presumably because they serve with joy and enthusiasm, rather than reluctantly, only for pay, or under duress. Whereas at one time the British Army called 'Volunteers' men who had often been tricked into taking the King's shilling while drunk, or as a way of avoiding the gallows, the word has now changed. The military began to describe part-time reservists as 'Volunteers' - which they by now truthfully were! - and across our society volunteers began to multiply in schools, hospitals, churches and charities, providing (especially for many women), a way of making a real positive difference in society and finding meaning and purpose in their own lives.

ut volunteering has a much older history, which we can trace back at least as far as the second book of the Old Testament. Moses himself had been a reluctant 'volunteer' when God told him to go and tell Pharaoh to let His people go! (Exodus 3:10 ff). God invested much time, encouraging words and the support of another volunteer - Moses' brother - before he eventually stepped forward to serve. From that point on Moses' exemplary life as a voluntary servant of God had life-changing consequences for him, for God's people, and for human history right down to this day.

Some forty years later Moses himself needs voluntary help with his mushrooming workload. "The work is too heavy for you; you cannot handle it alone", advises his wise father-in-law Jethro in Exodus 18:18. And so Moses begins to recruit apparently hundreds of fellow-believers to assist him voluntarily in his work. He had to be willing to let go, to delegate, to train and to trust, while they had to

be willing to submit, to learn, to work hard and to serve. For all of them, for Israel, for Moses, and indeed for us today, things would never be the same again. And in both cases the commitment involved was to be long-term.

CEF Britain has only a few full-time Christian workers, who work constantly and hard, with much skill and experience, but who, however hard they try, will never manage to reach more than a small percentage of the children in our nation. But if they could train others to serve as volunteers, whether doing direct evangelism, or in equally important back-stage rôles such as office work, then who knows how the work might grow!

Preaching the Gospel needs volunteers now more than ever before. The fields are still 'ripe for harvest', the labourers are still few, and the full-timers will never reach them all. Perhaps this article will serve the same function as Jethro did when he spoke to Moses, and begin

the process of recruiting you into voluntary service with CEF? Moses' helpers were not 'experts' either, but he helped them with the difficult parts of their work, and they appear to have learned on the job. We do not know their names, nor exactly how each one got on, but we do know that they played a vital part in God's work among His people - without their faithful, sacrificial and sustained effort Moses would not have had the time to climb Mount Sinai or to lead the people through the wilderness!

One final thought - did Moses and his assistants volunteer themselves - or were they first 'volunteered' by God Himself, at work in their hearts? If you are thinking of contacting CEF to offer yourself as a volunteer in this great work, then it will be because God is already at work in your heart, changing you so that you know that you want, even need, to offer yourself for service. And what God begins, He always finishes - to His greater Glory!

#### **CEF of Greece**

reece is a land of 10 million people and has 1,5 million children. Even though apostle Paul brought the Gospel to Greece, most Christians are nominal (97% are Greek Orthodox). They never read the Bible, and Evangelical Christians are considered heretics.

In 1965 a single lady pioneered CEF in Greece. For 25 years she was struggling alone, because Christians didn't believe in child evangelism. She was translating CEF materials to be used in Sunday schools, probably the only source back then.

In 1990 a young couple joined the ministry. Stefanos and Magda Botonis, started sharing the Gospel in schools, orphanages, and hospitals, even though there was a strict law against proselytism.

The Lord blessed the ministry and today we have 10 co-workers and many volunteers who evangelize children in Roma Gypsy camps, in



refugee centers, in schools and other institutions.

We work also with churches, providing training seminars for teachers and parents and teaching materials.

We made 150+ videos which are uploaded at our children's website: exerevnites.com. Some are broadcasted on a Greek channel.

Last year over 5000 children heard the Gospel through the ministry of CEF in Greece.

Children in Greece grow up without knowing the Gospel. When a young Roma boy came to know the Lord in a weekly Club years ago, he said: "when I grow up, I want to do the same: to teach children about God". Growing up, Stephen, became a volunteer with CEF and now God is leading him to become a full-time worker. We pray to God to provide for his support.

We praise God also for the camp that was donated to CEF, just 15 min. North of Thessaloniki. For 25 years we organize an Easter-, an art & craft-, a Sports-, a Teens-, a Musicand an English camp.

A major renovation is taking place this year. Two dorm houses were installed at the camp, that will host 64 people. We also plan to build a new kitchen and dining room.

There is a family living in the camp who also manage it, but we need one more couple to help in maintenance and other needs.

Short- and long-term interns are needed to help around the camp and work groups to help with different projects. If you are interested, let us know!
